INTRODUCTION

CONTEMPORARY PAINTINGS OF KARNATAKA

India as a whole present a picture of a spectacular spectrum. This is a blend of its varied cultural hues, each emanating radiant individuals characteristics as seen in their ideas, institutions, languages, literature and art.

One very brilliant unit in the south of this kaleidoscope is Karnataka, called in the vernacular as "Cheiuva Kannada Nadu". History reveals that in Deccan and further south the social pattern was formed based on geo-political influences of the region, a pattern which remained unbroken until recent times. The regional kingdoms that laid down the foundation of this rich heritage comes down from the builders of temples at Badami Aihole, and from the great connoisseurs of art the Satavahanas, the Chalukyas and the Vakatakas. While their successor the mighty Rashtrakutas, the powerful Vijayanagara kings and the Hoysalas further strengthened the regional flavour and consolidation it.

Contemporary Indian art, like Indian thought and India itself, is what it is because of centuries of interaction between the subcontinent and the rest of the world. In the words of Jawaharlal Nehru India is like some ancient palimpsest on which layer after layer of thought and reverie has been inscribed and yet no succeeding layer had completely hidden or erased what had been written previously.

Art in Karnataka as we know it today, was initially nurtured by artists like Venkatappa, Shivananda, S.P.Akki, Rumale Channabasappa and others. Venkatappa who introduced the famous style of Bengal School into Karnataka's emerging art scenario, received his formal training at Shantiniketan and was student of Nandalal Bose. Apart from being felicitated as Court Painter, he was further honoured by the Government by instituting a permanent art gallery in his name displaying his works and an award, the 'Karnataka State Venkatappa Award' in his memory.

A strong growing need for an art institution in Karnataka was felt by S.P.Akki, alumnus of Sir. J.J.School of Art, Mumbai. Art trend in Karnataka received a further boost under K.K.Hebbar and the Karnataka Lalit Kala Acedamy gained its momentum under his dynamic Chairmanship. Along with the academy, the art galleries also played a major role in moulding the art scene of Karnataka, mention may be made of, 'We Four' formed by T.K.Patel, S.S.Munoli, R.M.Hadapad and Hublikar. Mysore Art Council, Samyojitha and Kala Mela are some of the major events that strengthened the art movement in Karnataka. S.G.Vasudev, Shenoy and Hadapad supported the gradually spreading art movement in Karnataka. Meanwhile art school like the Chitrakala Parishat, Ken School of Art and Kalamandira of Bangalore, CAVA of Mysore, Vijay Kalamandira at Gadag, Art School at Devangere etc had emerged and the art scene was taking a purposeful direction in Karnataka.



• This catalogue attempts to give a brief biography of all the artists as well as the visuals of the works loaned by them for the benefit of one and all .




R.M. HADAPAD

R.M. HADAPAD (1936 -) who trained from the J.J. School of Arts in Bombay and completed Art Master course in 1963 is the Director of the Ken School of Art, Bangalore. Hadapad served as the Chairman of the Karnataka Lalit Kala Academy and Member of SZCC, Tanjore from 1987-1990, and as Senate Member, Hampi Kannada University. Hadapad has participated in Nineteen one-man and group show at Astien in Cheik Texsas (U.S.A.). Among the several awards won by him are the State and Central Lalit Kala Academy Awards, All India Lalit Kala & Kushala Kala Award and the Karnataka Rajyothsva, and the Karnataka State Venkatappa Award. He was conferred a Doctorate (Nadoja) Kannada Viswa by Vidhyalaya, Hampi in 1997.





RAMDAS ADYANTHAYA






















KALIDAS PATTAR








GAYATRI M. DESAI












C.V. AMBAJI
